Located in northwest Ohio, Kenton has a population of 8,300. Kenton is the county seat of Hardin County. While surrounded by agricultural businesses, Kenton also has a diverse group of manufacturing businesses. The previous school year, 63.7% of our students were eligible for free or reduced lunch rates.

**Five dual enrollment classes (Basic Chemistry DE, Calculus, College English, DE Anatomy & Physiology, and DE Elementary Statistics are weighted on a 5.0 scale.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

For the Class of 2014, 21 credits including 4 English, 4 Math, 3 Social Studies (one U.S. History and one American Government credit), 3 Science (one physical and one biological science), .5 Health, and .5 Physical Education are required. All students must pass or be exempt from all required sections of the Ohio Graduation Tests.

CURRICULUM

Most course titles on the transcript are self-explanatory. Please note that there are five University of Findlay dual enrollment classes offered (College English, Calculus, DE Anatomy & Physiology, and DE Elementary Statistics for seniors and Basic Chemistry DE for sophomores/juniors). These courses are weighted. Behavioral Science is a college preparatory social studies course covering psychology and sociology. College Prep Math is a senior course designed to prepare students for an introductory college algebra course.

Post-Secondary Enrollment Option courses are designated on the transcript using the course title/number and the name of the college. High school courses that are labeled ACC indicate accelerated courses.

Courses that begin with VLA, OASIS, or KOLA are online computer courses and may have been taken at an alternative school or outside the regular school day.

PROGRESS OF THE CLASS OF 2014

Based on six semesters with 139 students ranked, 52 students or 62.6% have a cum GPA of 3.0 or higher. The median cum GPA is 2.62. The distribution of the cum grade point averages of the middle 50% is 2.0-3.31.
